List of Days of the Week:

Lunes - Monday

Martes - Tuesday

Miércoles - Wednesday

Jueves - Thursday

Viernes - Friday

Sabado - Saturday

Domingo - Sunday

Days of the Week + Articles:

Most of the time, days of the week work with <u>definite articles</u> (el/los).

If you're not referring to an specific and concreat day of the week, you'll use <u>indefinite articles</u> (un/unos).

Days of the Week & Gender:

In Spanish, all days of the week are <u>masculine</u>. We use articles to mark their gender.



Examples:

No trabajo los lunes No trabajo los lunes

Tengo clase de español el viernes I have Spanish class on Friday

Si puedes, vamos un jueves. If you can, let's go on a Thursday.
