# WHAT ARE <u>ADVERBS</u> IN SPANISH

Adverbs are words that modify:

#### **VERBS**

They provide <u>information</u> about the action.



Eric y Alan cantan <u>bien</u>. Eric and Alan sing <u>well</u>.

## **ADJECTIVES & ADVERBS**

They <u>intensify</u> a quality.



Mis vecinas son <u>muy</u> amables. My neighbors are <u>very</u> sweet.

# <u>ADJECTIVES VS ADVERBS</u> IN SPANISH

### **ADJECTIVES**

Have gender & number. Work with <u>nouns</u>.



Laura tiene mucha <u>paciencia</u>. Laura has <u>a lot of patience</u>.



No gender or number. work with verbs, adj & adv.



Laura <u>trabaja</u> mucho. Laura <u>works</u> a lot.

# **TYPES OF <u>Adverbs</u> in Spanish**

## ADVERBS OF TIME



Help describe when or for how long an action takes place

## **PLACE & DISTANCE**



Specifies <u>where</u> an action takes place.

## **QUANTITY OR DEGREE**



## **ADVERBS OF MANNER**



Describes <u>how</u> an action takes places.


## TURNING <u>ADJECTIVES</u> INTO SPANISH ADVERBS

### Take the Adjective

Many adjectives can become adverbs if they can describe an action.

#### Add -mente

Adding '-mente' to the end of an adjective is the equivalent of English adverbs ending in '-ly'.



**Note:** Not all adjectives can become adverbs. <u>Adjectives of nationality</u>, <u>colors</u>, or <u>physical appearance</u> cannot be transformed into adverbs.

## **COMMON ADVERBIAL <u>PHRASES</u>**

A primera hora First thing

Al mismo tiempo At the same time **Con frecuencia** *Frequently* 

**De lejos** From far / from the distance

**De vez en cuando** Once in a while / From time to time Por fin Finally

**Por la mañana** *In the morning*  Por suerte Luckily **Sin duda** Without a doubt

Tal vez Maybe Todo el día All day Todos los días Every day

## **KEY POINTS:** <u>**ADVERBS</u> IN SPANISH**</u>

- Adverbs are a part of speech which <u>modify</u> a verb, adjective or another adverb.
- When modifying verbs, Spanish adverbs <u>describe the circumstances</u> surrounding the action.
- In Spanish, adverbs of time <u>work with verb</u> <u>tenses</u>. These adverbs are what students know as <u>trigger words</u> or <u>time markers</u>.

- The most common types of adverbs are <u>time, manner</u>, <u>place</u>, and <u>degree</u> or <u>quantity</u>.
- Adverbs <u>increase</u> or <u>decrease</u> the qualities expressed by an adjective or other adverbs.
- Spanish adverbs do <u>not</u> have <u>gender</u> or <u>plural</u> forms.
- Words ending in <u>-mente</u> are adverbs built from an adjective.
