## SUBJECT

Performs the action or is being described.



La pelota azul es del niño.  
The blue ball belongs to the kid.

## OBJECT

Receives the verb's action.



El niño patea la pelota.  
The kid kicks the ball.

## PROPER

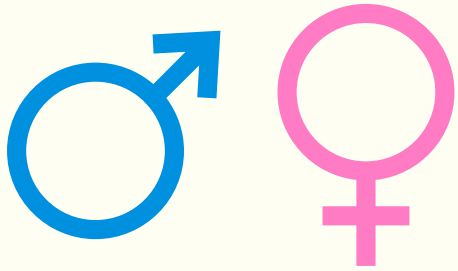

## COMMON

- Simple: silla, mesa.
- Compound: paraguas.
- Collective: gente, familia.
- Individual: persona, amigo.
- Concrete: manzana, lápiz.
- Abstract: idea, felicidad.
- Countable: vaso, litro.
- Uncountable: aire, calor.

# RULES FOR SPANISH NOUNS

## Gender



Spanish Nouns have gender. This means they can either be masculine or feminine.

## Plural Forms



The plural form refers to a group of things or people.

## Agreement



Adjectives & determiners must agree in number and, sometimes, in gender with nouns.

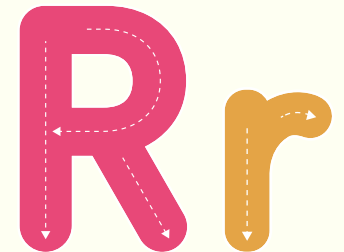
## Determiners

Nouns are always accompanied by a determiner.



## Capitalization

Spanish nouns and words have capitalization rules unique from English.
