


WORDS YOU MUST CAPITALIZE



SPANISH CAPITALIZATION RULES

CAPITALIZE

The first letter of:



- A word starting a sentence
- Proper nouns
- Holidays
- Movies and book titles
- Corporate and nobility titles
- Acronyms (all letters)

Alicia y Juan van a venir para Navidad.
Alicia and Juan are coming for Christmas.

DO NOT CAPITALIZE

Unless they start the sentence:



- Subject pronouns
- Months
- Days of the week
- Seasons
- Languages
- Nationalities

Andrea y yo no vamos a venir el lunes.
Andrea and I aren't coming on Monday.

HOLIDAYS

Capitalize the first letter of holidays.



Navidad
Año Nuevo
Día de la Madre

TITLES OF THINGS

The first letter of movies, book, and art work.



El laberinto del fauno
Cien años de soledad
Las cuatro estaciones de Vivaldi

TITLES OF PEOPLE

Used in formal environments.

Papa

ACRONYMS

Each letter is capitalized.



SUBJECT PRONOUNS




