ADJECTIVE PLACEMENT <u>CHANGES</u> MEANING

ADJECTIVE	BEFORE NOUN	AFTER NOUN
Antiguo	Previous / Former	Old
Cierto	Certain / One	True / Right
Gran / Grande	Great	Big
Mismo	Same	Self
Raro	Rare	Strange / Odd
Pobre	Poor / Unfortunate	Poor
Simple	Mere	Simple / Easy
Solo	Single / One	Alone / Lonely
Único	Only	Unique
Viejo	Former / Previous / Old	Old

PLACEMENT OF <u>ADJECTIVES</u> IN SPANISH

BEFORE THE NOUN

- Possessives (mi, mis, tu, tus..)
- Demonstratives (este, ese, aquel)
- Quantifiers (mucho, tanto, poco)
- Certain qualifying adjectives (apraisals)

<u>Esa</u> chica es Katia. Es una <u>buena</u> amiga. <u>That</u> girl is Katia. She is a <u>good</u> friend.

AFTER THE NOUN

Qualifying adjectives:

- Nationality
- Color
- Size or shape
- Physical appearance or personality

Quiero el carro <u>azul</u>. I want the <u>blue</u> car.

ADJECTIVES <u>BEFORE</u> & <u>AFTER</u> THE NOUN

BEFORE THE NOUN

Subjective valoration. It can change its meaning.

AFTER THE NOUN

Describes someone's characteristics.



<u>¡Pobre</u> hombre! Lo despidieron. <u>Poor</u> man! He was fired



KEY POINTS: <u>ADJECTIVE PLACEMENT</u> IN SPANISH

- The position of these words **depends on the information** they provide.
- Limiting adjectives (also called determiners) always **come before** the noun.
- Qualifying or descriptive adjectives **usually go after** the noun.
- <u>Spanish adverbs</u> are placed **before** adjectives, and they help you <u>intensify</u> its qualities.
- Descriptive adjectives can go <u>before</u> nouns when **providing an appraisal** about a person or thing.
- Certain qualifying words change their meaning based on their position in the sentence.
