







DEFINITE VS INDEFINITE WORDS IN SPANISH

DEFINITE WORDS

Refer to a <u>specific</u> or <u>precise</u> noun.



Él se comió <u>tres</u> manzanas. He ate <u>three</u> manzanas

INDEFINITE WORDS

Refer to an <u>unspecified</u> noun.



Él come <u>muchas</u> manzanas. He eats <u>a lot of</u> manzanas

SPANISH INDEFINITE PRONOUNS

KEY POINTS

- They <u>replace</u> nouns.
- Unlike a definite pronoun, with indefinites,
 the noun's identity is <u>unclear</u>.





Ella te llamó. She called you. Alguien te llamó. Someone called you.
