# WHAT ARE <u>SI CLAUSES</u> IN SPANISH

### **CONDITION** The <u>circumstance</u> that must be met.



<u>Si</u> llueve y no traigo paraguas... <u>If</u> it rains and I don't have an umbrella...

### **HYPOTHETICAL RESULT**

What <u>happens</u> if the condition is met.



...me voy a mojar. ...I'm going to get wet.

# **TYPES OF <u>SI CLAUSES</u> IN SPANISH**

**1ST CONDITIONAL** Highly likely to happen.

### **2ND CONDITIONAL** <u>Unlikely</u> to happen now or later.

### **3RD CONDITIONAL** Impossible to happen.



<u>Si no como</u>, voy a tener hambre. <u>If I don't eat</u>, I'll be hungry.



<u>Si fuera tú</u>, no iría. <u>If I was you</u>, I wouldn't go. <u>Si hubiera ido</u>, me habría divertido. <u>If I had gone</u>, I'd have fun.

# FIRST CONDITIONAL IN SPANISH KEY POINTS • The conditions are more realistic and

- <u>achievable</u>.
  Therefore, the result is <u>highly likely</u> to
  - happen in the present or future.
- Si + present condition + present / future



<u>Si tienes hambre</u>, hay comida en el refri. <u>If you're hungry</u>, there's food in the fridge.

# **SECOND <u>CONDITIONAL</u> IN SPANISH**

### KEY POINTS

- The conditions are currently <u>not</u> <u>true</u> and <u>difficult to achieve</u>.
- Therefore, the consequence is <u>unlikely</u> to happen.
- Si + unreal scenario + conditional



### <u>Si ganara la lotería</u>, dejaría de trabajar. <u>If I won the lottery</u>, I would stop working.

# THIRD <u>CONDITIONAL</u> IN SPANISH

### KEY POINTS

- <u>Past</u> conditions that can <u>no longer</u> be completed. So, the result is <u>imposible</u>.
- It relates to <u>regrets</u> and <u>unfulfilled</u> wishes.
- It's called the <u>unreal</u> past.
- Si + pluperfect subjunctive + conditional perfect.



<u>Si le hubieras dicho</u>, Linda te habría perdonado. <u>If you had told her</u>, Lind would've forgiven you.

<u>Si hubiera ido</u>, hubiera visto a mis amigos. <u>If I had gone</u>, I would've seen my friends.

Note: The pluperfect subjunctive can also be used to express the hypothetical result.
