

# SPANISH INDICATIVE MOOD

## KEY POINTS

- The indicative is one of the three verb moods in Spanish.
- The Spanish indicative is used to talk about the speaker's reality.
- It conveys information the speaker considers to be true or plausible.
- It has present, past, future and conditional tenses.



Sus amigos vieron un ovni.

His friends saw a UFO.

Mi casa es muy pequeña.

My house is very small.

# INDICATIVE MOOD SPANISH TENSES

## PRESENT SIMPLE



Tus amigas cantan muy mal.  
Your friends sing very badly.

## IMPERFECT



Mis vecinos trabajaban todo el día.  
My neighbors worked all day.

## PRETERITE




Clara no me habló en todo el día.  
Clara didn't speak to me all day.

## FUTURE SIMPLE



¿Qué comerán este fin de semana?  
What will you guys eat this weekend?

## FUTURE SIMPLE



¿Me ayudaría a contestar esta encuesta?  
Would you help me to answer this survey?


# INDICATIVE PRETERITE TENSE CONJUGATIONS

Person	Hablar	Beber	Dormir
Yo	Hablé	Bebí	Dormí
Tú	Hablaste	Bebiste	Dormiste
Él / Ella / Usted	Habló	Bebió	Durmío
Nosotros	Hablamos	Bebimos	Dormimos
Vosotros	Habláis	Bebisteis	Dormisteis
Ellos / Ellas / Ustedes	Hablaron	Bebieron	Durmieron

# SPANISH INDICATIVE VS SUBJUNCTIVE MOOD

## INDICATIVE MOOD

Communicates facts or things we believe to be true.



Él viene a visitarme mañana.  
Tomorrow, he comes to visit.

## SUBJUNCTIVE MOOD

Conveys wishes, doubts, suggestions, or feelings towards an action.



Espero que él venga a visitarme mañana.  
I hope he comes to visit tomorrow.

# KEY POINTS: SPANISH INDICATIVE MOOD

- Unlike the subjunctive mood, the indicative mood in Spanish relates to reality.
- It's used to convey what the speaker believes to be factual information. Some real applications include talking about:
  - Habits
  - Descriptions
  - Plans and memories
  - Likes and dislikes
- The indicative uses different tenses to place an action at a specific point in time.
- The main indicative tenses are the present, preterite, imperfect, future, and conditional.
  - These tenses also have progressive and perfect forms.
