### **HOW TO ASK QUESTIONS IN SPANISH**

#### KEY POINTS

- Affirmative and negative sentences can be transformed into questions by <u>changing</u> the intonation.
- Spanish question words <u>inquire</u> more information rather than a simple 'yes/no' answer.
- Spanish <u>prepositions</u> are always placed <u>at the beginning</u> of the question.



¿Estás bien? Are you okay?

¿A quién le hablas? Who are you talking to?

### **SPANISH QUESTION WORDS**

<u>QUÉ</u>

Asks time, facts, definitions -> ¿Qué es eso? / What is that?



#### <u>CUÁL</u>

Personal info and preferences -> ¿Cuál color te gusta? / Which color do you like?





Asks about location -> ¿Dónde estás? / Where are you?



#### <u>СÓМО</u>

Asks about manner or method -> ¿Cómo lo haces? / How do you do it?



### **SPANISH QUESTION WORDS**



#### <u>CUÁNDO</u>

Asks timing -> ¿Cuándo vas a ir? / When will you go?

#### <u>QUIÉN</u>

Asks about identity or people -> ¿Quién es ella? / Who is that?



#### <u>POR QUÉ</u>

Asks about reasons -> ¿Por qué estás aquí? / Why are you here?



#### <u>CUÁNTO</u>

Asks about amounts -> ¿Cuánto cuesta? / How much is it?



<b>QUESTIONS VS STATEMENTS IN SPANISH</b>	
Statement	Question
Te gustan los gatos.	¿Te gustan los gatos?
You like cats.	Do you like cats?
Ellos saben dónde está el museo.	¿Ustedes saben dónde está el museo?
They know where the museum is.	Do you guys know where the museum is?

# WORD ORDER WHEN ASKING QUESTIONS

#### WITHOUT QUESTION WORDS

(Subject) + [verb] + [complement]

¿Ana <u>habla</u> español? Does Ana <u>speak</u> Spanish?

> ¿<u>Tienes</u> hambre? <u>Are</u> you hungry?

#### WITH QUESTION WORDS

[Question word] + [verb] + [complement]

¿<u>Por qué</u> está enojada Ana? <u>Why</u> is Ana mad?

¿<u>Qué</u> comieron ayer? <u>What</u> did you guys eat yesterday?

## **KEY POINTS: ASKING QUESTIONS IN SPANISH**

- An affirmative or negative sentence can be transformed into a question by changing the intonation.
- Questions in Spanish must be surrounded by two question marks.
- Question words in Spanish are used to request information rather than a 'yes/no' answer.
- Spanish prepositions are never placed at the end of the question.
- In Spanish, you do not need auxiliary verbs to ask questions.
