
# **DOUBLE L SPANISH SOUND HOW TO** PRONOUNCE LL IN SPANISH



### **HOW TO PRONOUNCE LL IN SPANISH**

For the most part, the ll pronunciation is close to the English 'j', and sometimes 'y' sounds. Here is how the Spanish vowels sound when working with the double ll (lla, lle, lli, llo, llu):

Spanish word	Sounds like
Llamar (call)	<u>Ja</u> m
Ella (she/her)	<u>Ja</u> net
Ballena (whale)	<u>Ye</u> llow
Pollo (chicken)	<u>Jo</u> b
Lluvia (rain)	<u>Yu</u> sef

### **DOUBLE LL SOUND VARIATIONS**

#### **RIOPLATENSE SPANISH**

In this dialect (Argentina & Uruguay), the Spanish ll sounds like a 'sh' -



Llave - Shave

Cabello - Cabesho

<u>Ll</u>uvioso - <u>Sh</u>uvioso

#### **CENTRAL AMERICA**

Sounds like if you combined the Spanish 'i' with another vowel in other Central American Countries.



Llama - <u>la</u>ma

Calle - Caie

Pollo - Poio



# **KEY POINTS: DOUBLE L SPANISH SOUND**

- The double l is also called elle.
- Ll is not a letter in the alphabet because it's a digraph.
- The double ll <u>sounds exactly</u> like the letter y in Spanish. This is called <u>yeismo</u>, and it's the most standard way to pronounce this sound.
- The Spanish Il sounds <u>close</u> to the English letters 'j' and 'y'.
- In Argentina and Uruguay, the double I has a <u>'sh' sound</u> (like sharp, Shonda, shed).
