Express nationality



Carlos es italiano.
Carlos is Italian.

Numbers in Spanish



Treinta y tres.
Thirty-three.

-AR, -ER, -IR Verbs



Cantar, poner, vivir.
To sing, to put, to live.

Definite & indefinite articles



No me gustó el pastel.
I didn't like the cake.

Subject pronouns



Ellos hablan inglés.
They speak English.

Present Indicative Tense



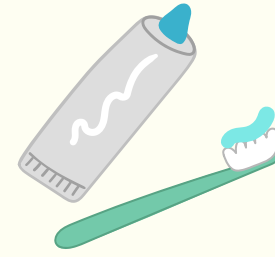
Tenemos examen mañana.

Basic Prepositions



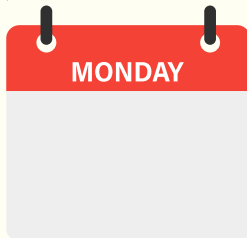
Soy de México.

Reflexive Verbs



Yo me cepillo los dientes.

Days of the Week



Los lunes trabajo hasta las 8.
On Mondays, I work until 8.

Common Verbs



Tuve que limpiar mi cuarto.
I had to clean my room.

Order Food in a Restaurant



Para mí, va a ser un pozole.
I'll have a pozole.

Los sábados íbamos a visitar a mis papás.

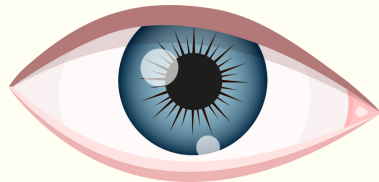
Saturdays we went to visit my parents.

Sus ojos son azules.

Her eyes are blue.

Preterite Tense



Los chicos llegaron tarde.

The boys arrived late.

Hoy no fuimos a la oficina.
We didn't go to the office today.

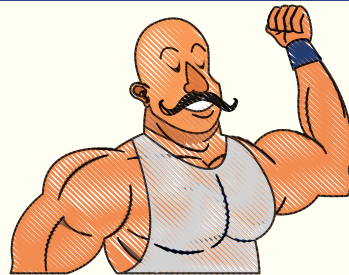
Express Politeness

Adjectives to Describe People



Saúl es **pequeño** y **musculoso**.

Saul is **short** and **muscular**.

Talk about Likes and Dislikes



Me gustan mucho las fresas.

I like strawberries very much.

Direct Object Pronouns



Dámela, por favor.

Give **it** to me, please.

Past (Imperfect) Habits & Routines



Jackie y yo **jugábamos** todos los días.

Jackie and I **played** every day.

Present Progressive Tense



¿Qué **estás comiendo**?

What **are** you **eating**?

Ayer estuvo lloviendo todo el día.
Yesterday it was raining all day.

Form Impersonal Expressions



Hoy hace mucho calor.
Today is very hot.

Capitalization Rules



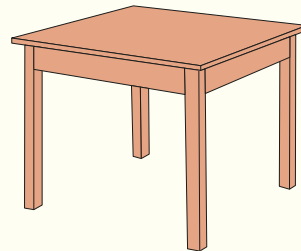
La tienda no abre los lunes.
The store doesn't open on Mondays.

Basic Si Clauses



Si quieres, te llamo más tarde.
If you want, I can call you later.

Express Prohibition & Obligation



Hay que limpiar la mesa.
The table needs to be cleaned.

Future Simple Tense



El próximo jueves iré al aeropuerto.
I will go to the airport next Thursday.

Connecting Words



Llegué tarde debido al tráfico.
I'm late due to the traffic.

Express Agreement & Disagreement



Tampoco queremos ir.
We don't want to go either.

Present subjunctive



Es muy probable que hoy haga calor.
It will likely be hot today.

Uses of Indirect Object Pronouns



Joe les enseña.
Joe teaches them.

Placing Reflexive & Object Pronouns



Dámela la, por favor.
Give it to me, please.

Passive voice



La pizza es preparada por el chef.
The pizza is prepared by the chef.

Uses of the Present Subjunctive



Espero que tengas un buen día.
I hope you have a good day.

Uses of the Conditional



Nos gustaría ir a París el próximo año.
We would like to go to Paris next year.

Se Impersonal



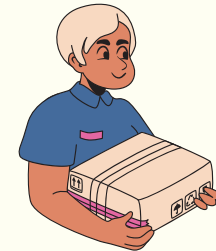
La carne se cocina así.
The meat is cooked this way.

Conditionals & Hypotheticals



Si hubieras ido, te habrías divertido.
If you had gone, you would have had fun.

Imperfect subjunctive



Les pedí que tuvieran cuidado.
I asked you to be careful.

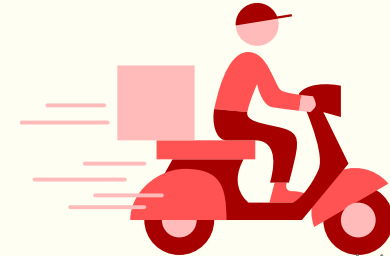

Les recomendé que vieran una película.
I recommended them to watch a movie.

Uses of Por & Para



La entrega es para el lunes.
The delivery is for Monday.

Relative Clauses



Los chicos con los que trabajamos son muy amables.
The guys with whom we work are very nice.

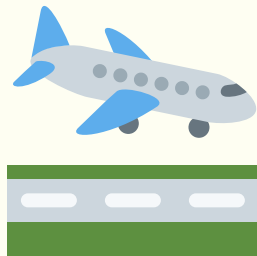
SPANISH LEVEL C1: ADVANCED

Use Indirect Speech



Alba dijo que lavarlas y doblaras la ropa.
Alba said to wash and fold the clothes.

Use and Form the Future Perfect



En dos horas, habremos llegado.
We will have arrived in two hours.

Express Wishes & Hypotheses in the Past



Tim y Luke esperaban que pudiéramos ayudarlos.
Tim and Luke hoped that we could help them.

Form Subordinate Clauses



Mi amiga, quien es doctora, es muy amable.
My friend, who is a doctor, is very nice.

SPANISH LEVEL C1: ADVANCED

Combine Past Tenses



Ya se habían ido cuando llegué.
They were gone when I arrived.

Past Perfect Subjunctive



¡Ojalá te hubiera dicho lo que siento!
I wish I had told you what I feel!

Use Interjections & Expressions to Narrate



¡Ay! No es para tanto.
Jeez! It's not a big deal.
