COMMON USES OF SER IN SPANISH

USE	SENTENCE	USE	SENTENCE
Identifying people or things	Él <u>es</u> Luis. He <u>is</u> Luis.	Physical & Personality Traits	Tú <u>eres</u> muy amable. You <u>are</u> very kind.
Material of something	La silla <u>es</u> de madera. The chair <u>is</u> made of wood.	Place of an event.	La fiesta <u>es</u> en mi casa. The party <u>is</u> at my house.
Occupation	Sandy <u>es</u> doctora. Sandy <u>is</u> a doctor.	Possession & Relationships	Yo <u>soy</u> su hermana. I <u>am</u> her sister.
Origin & Nationality	Ustedes <u>son</u> de Alemania. You guys <u>are</u> from Germany.	Time	El examen <u>es</u> en la tarde. The exam <u>is</u> in the afternoon.

COMMON USES OF ESTAR IN SPANISH

USE	SENTENCE	USE	SENTENCE
Actions in progress	<u>Estoy</u> comiendo. I <u>am</u> eating.	Location or position	Tú <u>estás</u> en España. You <u>are</u> in Spain.
Conditions	Hoy <u>está</u> soleado. Today <u>is</u> sunny.		
Emotions or states	<u>Estamos</u> ocupados. We <u>are</u> busy.	Temporary occupation	July <u>está</u> de mesera. July <u>is</u> a waiter.

SER = D.O.C.T.O.R.

ESTAR = P.L.A.C.E.

- Place
- Location
- Actions in progress

SER VS ESTAR: THE GOLDEN RULE

I've found that the easiest way to summarize them is by identifying the questions they answer.

SER

Answers these questions:

- Who are you?
- What are you?
- Where are you from?
- What time is it?
- When and where is...?

ESTAR

Answers these questions:

- Where are you?
- How are you? / How are you doing?
- What are you doing?

Note: Although they're posed to "you", these questions apply to all people and things (subjects and objects).

EXPRESSING LOCATION: SER OR ESTAR

SER

Describes the location of an event.



La fiesta es en la casa de Jorge.

The party is at Jorge's.

ESTAR

Expresses the location of something.



La torre Eiffel está en París.

The Eiffel tower is in Paris.

EXPRESSING OCUPPATION: SER OR ESTAR

SER

Refers to a profession or long-term job.



Su papá **es** maestro.

His dad **is** a teacher.

ESTAR

Refers to temporary occupations.



Yolanda **está de** doctora en la farmacia local.

Yolanda **is** a doctor in the local pharmacy.

EXPRESSING CHARACTERISTICS: SER OR ESTAR

SER

Refers to inherent characteristics.
What someone is.



Marta es muy aburrida.

Marta is very boring.

ESTAR

Expresses how someone is or feels at a specific moment.



Marta está aburrida.

Marta is bored.

HAY VS SER VS ESTAR

HAY

Indicates the existence of something.



Hay un perro en el jardín.
There is a dog in the garden.

SER

Identifies & describes inherent qualities.



El perro es grande y blanco.
The dog is big and white.

ESTAR

Conveys location or temporary conditions.



Mi perro está en mi cuarto.
My dog is in my room.

SER VS ESTAR CONTEXTUAL OVERLAP & CONFUSION

Ser	Estar
<u>Date</u> Hoy <u>es</u> cinco de mayo. Today <u>is</u> May 5th.	<u>Date (informal)</u> Hoy <u>estamos</u> a cinco de mayo. Today <u>is</u> the 5th of May.
<u>Occupation</u> Tú <u>eres</u> abogado. You <u>are</u> a lawyer.	<u>Occupation (temporary)</u> Tú <u>estás</u> de mesero. You <u>are</u> a waiter.
<u>Personality & Physical traits</u> Joe <u>es</u> alto. Joe <u>is</u> tall.	<u>Conditions & States</u> Joe <u>está</u> cansado. Joe <u>is</u> tired.
<u>Place of an event</u> La boda <u>es</u> en Toronto. The wedding <u>is</u> in Toronto.	<u>Location of things or people</u> <u>Estamos</u> en Toronto. We <u>are</u> in Toronto.

KEY POINTS: SER VS ESTAR IN SPANISH

- Both 'ser' and 'estar' mean 'to be', but have distinctive meanings and applications.
- In a nutshell, the difference between 'ser' and 'estar' is that ser refers to permanent or lasting traits, while estar refers to temporary conditions.
- 'Ser' is used to:
 - Identify people or things
 - Say the date and time
 - Describe people or things
 - Refer to the place of an event
 - Express origin or nationality
 - Talk about occupation
- 'Estar' is used to:
 - Talk about progressive actions
 - Express location and position
 - Describe conditions, emotions and states
 - Refer to temporary occupations

KEY POINTS: SER VS ESTAR IN SPANISH

- When referring to characteristics, 'ser' refers to identity or traits that make a person or thing what they are. 'Estar' expresses how something is at a particular moment.
- There are some adjectives whose meanings change depending on the verb you use.
- 'Ser' responds to the questions:
 - Who are you?
 - What are you?
 - Where are you from?
 - What time is it?
 - When and where is...?
- Meanwhile, 'estar' answers:
 - Where are you?
 - How are you? / How are you doing?
 - What are you doing?
- Neither ser or estar are used to say age.
