



DIFFERENCE BETWEEN HABER & TENER

HABER VS TENER

HABER

Existence, auxiliary, impersonal obligation.



Si ya no **hay** leche, **hay** que traer más.
If there's no milk anymore, let's bring more.

TENER

Possession and personal obligation.



Si **tienes** mascotas, **tienes que** cuidarlas.
If you have pets, you **have** to take care of them.

WHEN TO USE HABER IN SPANISH

EXPRESS EXISTENCE



¿Cuántos gatos hay?
How many cats **are there?**

AUXILIARY VERB



Ha ido a Europa tres veces.
she's gone to Europe three times.

IMPERSONAL OBLIGATION



Hay que hablar con ella.
We must talk to her.

Note: Impersonal obligation doesn't target anyone specific.

WHEN TO USE TENER IN SPANISH

EXPRESS POSSESSION



¿Cuántos gatos **tienes**? Yo no **tengo** ninguno.
How many cats **do you have**? I **have** none.

OBLIGATION



Tienes **que** hablar con ella porque yo ya **tengo que** irme.
You **have to** talk to her because I **have to** go now.

Note: The obligation with 'tener' targets someone specific.
